Allotments Anyone?

The article in the June newsletter provided some indication of the level of interest for allotments within the village and, in order to try to progress this issue, we are launching this final appeal for residents who would be interested in having an allotment in the village to come forward.

We need to demonstrate a definite requirement within the village to support requests to the Borough and County Councils for the provision of land so, if you would be interested in having an allotment, please contact Alan Platt, the Clerk to the Council (contact details on this page).

Obviously we can't have allotments without land so, if you know of land which might be available or are a landowner with 'spare' land please let us know.

Country Trail

Unfortunately the Lancashire Environmental Fund saw fit to refuse our application for grant funding towards the project to create a useable footpath all the way around the Recreation Fields for walkers and pushchair and wheelchair users.

In considering the application the Board felt 'the scheme did not represent good value for money and that the case for creating an all access path had not been demonstrated'. An appeal, in the June newsletter, for support from residents received a disappointing response so, as we may be able to re-apply in the future, could we once again ask for letters/emails of support from residents who feel a path around the Recreation Fields would be of benefit.

Got the Hump?

Back in 2007, following the Parish Council's request for traffic calming measures for Drapers Avenue and Doctors Lane we were presented with a scheme which, in addition to the areas requested, included other estate roads within the village.

When we queried this with Lancashire County Council staff and our local Councillor we were advised it was an all or nothing, take it or leave it, situation which a clear majority of residents were in favour of and that the estate roads were included to avoid them turning into 'rat runs' - a statement which probably bemuses the residents of Beechfields, Red House Lane, Larkfield etc as much as it did the Parish Council. In the interests of users of Drapers Avenue and Doctors Lane we, rather reluctantly, accepted what was offered.

A number of residents have approached the Council requesting the speed humps be removed from several of the estate roads, as it is felt they cause more problems than they solve, and we would like to make sure the opinions of as many residents as possible are taken into account. Eccleston Apple Day

Eccleston Apple Day 2008, held last October, designed by Creative Minds and St Mary's Primary School, received a Green Partnership award in June, for the contribution made to improve the environment for the benefit of the community through the use of a Green Partnership Grant. School Representatives received the award at County Hall.

Besides promoting a day of advice, information and activities, the highlight was the Apple Den designed and made from willow recycled from the Millennium Green. The commissioned artist was Samantha Aylwin. Funding is being sought for an Apple Day in 2009 to keep alive the tradition and heritage of Eccleston orchards and to support the nationwide revival of interest in the culture of English apples.

It has been noted that more and more artificial flowers and embellishments of various kinds eg extra vases, toys, plaques etc are being introduced on graves and cremation plots.

We have been given a directive from the Diocesan Advisory Committee that these are not allowed and should be removed. Your co-operation, as soon as possible, will be greatly appreciated.

Digital Switchover

The Digital Switchover in the Granada TV region begins on 4 November 2009, when the analogue BBC2 signal will cease. On 2 December the remaining analogue channels will also be switched off.

Residents with Freeview, Top Up TV or BT Vision will need to re-install/retune their receivers on both dates.

All non-digital TV's will need a digibox to receive a signal and these can be obtained for around £20 from most major supermarkets/electrical retailers.

Most homes will not need replacement aerials so don't fall for any sharp sales practice from TV aerial suppliers.
