Your Village Needs You!

We now have three vacancies on the Parish Council and residents with an interest in the Village are invited to apply to join us (we know there are many from the numbers attending our Planning Group meetings at St Mary's School!).

Former Chairman Christine Chu, and Councillors Christine Heydon and Sue Ward have, unfortunately, all recently left the Council, and we would like to thank each of them for their past service and wish them well for the future.

Anyone interested should simply write, or email, the Clerk (contact details on this page) stating why you would like to join the Council and providing brief background details.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject, aged over 18 years old and an elector, must reside in, or within 3 miles of, the Ecclestone Parish boundary or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor.

Country Trail

The first phase of the Parish Council's project to enhance the Recreation Fields area, off Drapers Avenue, has been completed. Funded by a grant of £7250 from Awards for All, the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers (BTCV) has carried out hedgelaying, scrub clearance and woodland management works, planted a wildflower glade and improved a drainage ditch to help create a wetland area in the future.

The Parish Council is trying to obtain further funding to create a useable footpath all the way around the Recreation Fields for walkers and pushchair and wheelchair users and it would certainly help with applications to funders if residents, who might take advantage of the proposed improvements in the future, could register their support for this in the form of letters or emails to the Parish Council.

We are very pleased with the results so far and would like to thank Awards for All for the grant and Kath Godfrey and all at BTCV for their hard work.

Same Again for 2009

At the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council in May Bill Mason was re-elected to serve as Chairman for the coming year, with Les Armstrong also being re-elected as Vice Chair.

Annual Report of Eccleston Parish Council

The Parish Council met on twelve occasions during the last year to discuss matters relating to the village of Eccleston and I would like to thank my fellow councillors and our Clerk, Alan Platt, for their support and assistance throughout the year. I would also like to thank our Village Caretaker and Lengthsman for their sterling work in all weathers. Our village is certainly a more pleasant place for their efforts.

Our finances remain strong to meet the further needs of the village. There has been a small increase in the Parish Precept for 2009/10 specifically to promote some village activities for our residents, both young and old. A small group has been formed to organise these and interested residents are welcome to join.

Planning continues to be the most controversial subject discussed by the Parish Council. Whilst decisions are made by Chorley Council, the Parish Council endeavours to promote the views of local residents to the Planning Committee. To assist in this a small Planning Group has been established which appears to be popular with residents.

The Parish Council has been supported by our elected representatives on Chorley Council and Lancashire County Council, as well as our Community Police Team. As Chairman I have represented the Parish Council at the local PACT meetings.

The British Trust for Conservation Volunteers has carried out some work on the Recreation Fields, funded by a grant from Awards for All and we are seeking further grants to complete the project which will provide a Country Trail around the Fields. We further improved the facilities with the addition of picnic tables and new exercise equipment and replaced the damaged surface of the Skatepark with a far more suitable surface (according to our Bladers, Bikers and Boarders!).

The Millennium Green saga continues with the Parish Council anxious to adopt but with much foot-dragging by the official bodies involved.
