# Diamond Jubilee

The Parish Council is hoping to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee in 2012, with an event proposed for Saturday June 2 2012 on the Recreation Fields.

The event will be based on a 1950's themed 'Big Picnic', and will offer everyone the opportunity to celebrate the occasion. One of the aims is to encourage people who would, or would not, have attended either Street Parties, or their own garden parties, to bring their own party to a larger, village event.

To date, ideas for the event include a live band that could feature as the main attraction, singing appropriate songs live, from the 50's, with additional attractions including a Children's Entertainer/Punch and Judy show.

The Parish Council would like to hear from other organisations within the village who may be interested in joining in with the event eg you might want to display memorabilia or organisational records from the 50's.

Further suggestions for discussion include for the Council to consider the renaming of Bradley Lane field as 'The Queen Elizabeth II Field' and for this ceremony to take place in line with the event occurring to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee. Also to see whether a long term scheme to develop a path around the Recreation Fields or, alternatively a 'Diamond Walk' path for able bodied and less able people to be able to access the wooded areas, might be completed in time to coincide with the event.

If anyone is organising their own events please make sure you look into the legal and health and safety aspects - you might need to arrange for a road closure if you're having a street party and possibly a music licence and/or a licence if alcohol is to be sold at your event.

## Carol Singing

Come along and join in with members of the Parish Council at the Carol Concert, around the Christmas tree on the Village Green, on Tuesday 20 December 2011 between 6.30pm and 7.15pm.

This will be the fifth year the Carol Singing, arranged by the Parish Council, has taken place and the number of residents attending seems to grow each year.

Musical accompaniment will be provided by members of Eccleston Brass Band and we are hoping to avoid a repeat of last year's Siberian winter conditions which froze the instruments for a while.

As per usual, due to the lack of available parking in the vicinity, residents are asked, wherever possible, not to come in cars.

## Safer Streets at 20mph

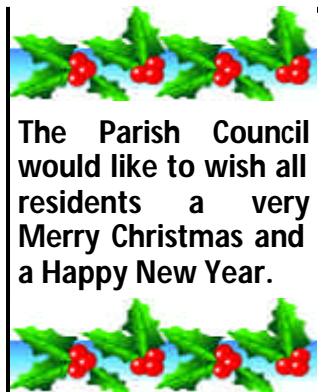
Lancashire County Council is committed to making Lancashire safer through the introduction of 20mph sign only schemes in all residential areas and outside every school in Lancashire by the end of 2013.

This long-term approach aims to encourage drivers to reduce their speed and accept 20mph limits in residential areas and roads surrounding schools as a normal part of community life. Commuter routes, trunk and main roads will be largely unaffected.

Road casualties damage lives and communities and children face the greatest dangers. Studies show that even slight reductions in speed result in quite significant reductions in accident rates.

Road safety, particularly the safety of children and young people, is one of the key priorities highlighted in the Local Transport Plan, with the roll out of 20mph speed limit areas as one major way to manage the speed of drivers and riders to safer levels.

Changing drivers' attitudes and influencing positive behavioural change will not happen overnight. Implementation will be followed up with education, community engagement and enforcement activity. With support from and working with Lancashire Constabulary, initiatives such as community road watch and targeted enforcement of speed limits will work to make speeding in residential areas and outside schools socially unacceptable in the longer term.



The Parish Council would like to wish all residents a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

For individual schemes, localised consultation will be carried out with residents, County Council and District Council members, Parish Councils and other representative groups in the local community. As part of the legal process residents will be informed of proposals in the local area on a scheme by scheme basis.

## Lancashire Constabulary

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team asks that residents in the village be extra vigilant at this time of year, to prevent themselves becoming victims of crime. We are asking you not to leave presents on display through house windows and in vehicles and, when you have purchased or received expensive items, for example TV's, computers, bikes etc, only put the packaging out on the morning of the refuse collection. For everyone who receives bikes, scooters etc for Christmas please keep them secure when not in use.

When using bikes at night please remember to have working lights. Also, ideally, wear a helmet for safety reasons. PCSO Maria Fetherstone has a limited number of free cycle helmets available in the run up to Christmas. Anyone interested should contact Maria at Coppull Police Station on 01257 246103.

For the people who have bikes and scooters, in the New Year we will hold a cycle coding event in the village.

With the cold weather in mind and whilst defrosting your vehicles, please do not leave your engine running when you are not with the vehicle - opportunist thieves love this time of year because you warm your car up for them to jump into and drive off. Should this happen your insurance will not pay out!

Drink driving ruins lives and throughout December and over the Xmas period drivers should expect to be stopped and tested.

## Handyperson Service

**Chorley Council is delighted to announce the formation of a new partnership with Preston Care and Repair to provide a handyperson service to vulnerable people.**

The Council is committed to ensuring that residents in need of a little extra help with the repair and maintenance of their homes receive a prompt, reliable and value for money service.

The handyperson technicians will tackle any job that can be considered within the definition of "DIY" - from changing light bulbs to joinery, cutting back shrubs or power washing drives. Gas and electrical work is not included in their remit, and jobs should normally not take more than two hours to complete.

Clients pay only a £10 per hour contribution, plus the cost of any materials needed, and they are advised on any costs before the work commences.

The service is available to older and/or disabled homeowners or private tenants in the borough.
