## Council Tax Down!

The Parish Council's budget for the next financial year shows a 5.1% reduction in the cost of the Parish Precept to residents .

In view of the current financial climate the Parish Council wanted to make sure the burden on council tax payers will not increase this year. Careful budgeting and prudent financial management has allowed the reduction without affecting the services currently provided by the Council.

These services include the Village Caretaker, who looks after the Recreation Fields, play areas and other open spaces, and attends to minor repairs to council property, the Village Lengthsman, who picks litter from the major routes and estate roads. The Council is also responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the Recreation Fields and Changing Rooms, the Drapers Avenue Play Area and Skate Park, the Millennium Green, Hawthorns Play Area and the Village Green. Mowing of the entrance to The Hawthorns is also carried out by the Parish Council. The Council also provides the Christmas Tree and lights, lighting for the path between Drapers Avenue and Richmond Road, wayside seats, emptying of dog waste bins and the relevant public and employers liability insurance cover.

The reduction means that the cost of the Parish Precept to residents is now virtually the same as it was in 2003 - something the Parish Council is extremely proud of.

## New Model

Residents may have noticed Parish Council Lengthsman, Malc Hayes, in proud possession of his shiny new litter cart.

Lancashire County Council awarded Chorley Council funding for four segregated hand carts to help raise waste and recycling performance and the Parish Council was successful with a bid for a cart.

The Parish Council employees have been recycling waste as a matter of course for several years now so no changes to collection methods were needed and the new cart came at a time when the old one was badly in need of replacement.

## **Chairman's Message**

I would like to thank my fellow Councillors and our Clerk, Alan Platt, for their support and assistance throughout the year. Also to thank our Parish Caretaker, Mike Marsh, and Parish Lengthsman, Malcolm Hayes for their sterling work in all weathers. They were certainly put to the test at the end of 2010 with the exceptionally cold weather. Our village is certainly a more pleasant place due to their efforts.

Our finances remain strong to meet the further needs of the village. As such Eccleston Parish Council has announced a 5.1% reduction in the cost of the Parish Precept to residents for the next financial year. Robust financial management and careful budgeting has allowed this reduction, with no loss in the services provided to residents by the Parish Council. The Parish Council was very keen, given the current financial climate, to do what it could to make sure the burden on council tax payers would not been increased this year. It is interesting to note that our local newspapers have ignored our press release about this reduction. Presumably they are only interested in bad or sensational news.

Planning continues to be the most controversial subject discussed by the Parish Council. Whilst decisions are made by Chorley Borough Council, the Parish Council endeavours to promote the views of local residents to the Planning Committee. The public consultation by Northern Trust about the proposed redevelopment of the Carrington Centre has certainly caused controversy amongst the residents of our village. The Council meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> February was certainly the best attended during my time on the Council. Please continue to let the Parish Council have your constructive views about the Carrington Centre whether you are for or against the proposals. Obviously the Parish Council cannot take a formal position until the actual planning application is submitted to Chorley Borough Council by Northern Trust.

Not only was the meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> February attended by residents concerned about the Carrington Centre proposals, but we also had a significant number of young people attending who were concerned about potential changes to the Youth Service in the village. Their representatives spoke eloquently about the problems faced by young people and the importance of the Youth Club. Both the Parish Council and our elected Borough and County Councillors agreed to support the young people in retaining a viable Youth Service in the village. I am sure that all residents will agree that co-operation between the Parish Council and the Youth Club is essential to continue to make Eccleston a better place for both young and old.
