Parish Council Meetings are held on the 2nd Thursday of each month in The Changing Rooms, Drapers Avenue, commencing at 7.30pm. All residents are welcome to attend.

A part of each meeting is set aside specifically for residents to air their views on local issues - come along and have your say!

Fantastic news from Chorley Council - our bid, prepared in conjunction with representatives from Eccleston Young People's Centre, has been successful and we have been awarded £77000 for the All Weather Ball Court.

The funding has come from the planning contribution associated with the redevelopment of the Sagar House site and we are very pleased the money is being spent within the village.

The next stage is to secure the necessary planning permission and we are now working to finalise the planning application for submission to Chorley Council.

The facility will be located by the Band Hut close to the boundary with the Carrington Centre site and will be available for use in all weathers to discourage playing football etc on the car park areas. It is intended to be lit in the early evening, with timer controlled lighting which will switch off to prevent late use.

Our thanks go to everyone who has assisted in getting us to this stage including the representatives from the Young People's Centre, the local residents who provided valuable input at Committee meetings and Lindsey Blackstock, Chorley Council's Parks and Open Spaces Officer, for her help in preparing the bid and securing the funds.

Carrington Centre

At the time of going to print the Council has received confirmation from Northern Trust that Sainsbury's has signed the contract to take on the convenience store premises in the redeveloped Carrington Centre.

Northern Trust has also kindly provided this programme of scheduled works for resident's information:

Construction commenced early July

Co-op vacated July

Demolish Co-op and provide additional temporary car parking

Shop fronts to be fitted mid September

Individual unit internal fit outs between end of September and beginning of November

Food store fit out mid Oct-mid Nov

Independent tenants occupy new units mid November

Demolish remaining existing units

Car parks and access roads to be completed end Feb 2014

Bill has led the council with integrity in dealing with the many & varied issues that have arisen over this time, especially the development of the Sagar House site, and now the Carrington Centre. I am very glad that Bill has chosen to stay on as a councillor so that we continue to benefit from his experience.

The Council sub-committees have continued to work on projects that hopefully benefit the village. The Events Committee organised the funfair that took place in late June - whilst the weather that week was not ideal we hope that people enjoyed themselves. The Open Spaces Committee has been working very hard with the village's Young People's Centre to bring about the provision of an all - weather ball court. Now that funding has been agreed by Chorley Council (see page 1), the Committee is working to obtain planning permission.) Hopefully there will be positive news on this in the next newsletter

The Carrington Centre re-development is now underway, and hopefully the building work progresses smoothly to minimise the disruption to our residents and the local retailers. The developer, Northern Trust, has provided an outline of the development schedule (see article on front page) which is also on display on the Parish Council boards. It is important for our village, especially for those residents who are particularly reliant on local shops and services, that life returns to normal as soon as possible.

Information from the Environment Agency

By Autumn 2013, we will close our depots at Garstang, Great Hanging Bridge in Croston and Fine Jane depot in Downholland, near Formby and moving our staff to Spurrier House, Lancashire Business Park, Centurion Way, Leyland, PR26 6TP.

The Leyland depot will be a base for our Operation Teams who manage and maintain our rivers and importantly who respond prior to and during heavy rainfall. This will improve our responsiveness in protecting homes and communities across the area. Our level of service will remain unchanged and our front line response will not be affected as our officers will be mobile in their vehicles to transport machinery on site.

All our pumping stations including: Altmouth near Hightown, North Merseyside, Crossens near Banks, West Lancashire; and Dock Bridge near Lytham on the Fylde coast are not affected. These pumping stations, which manage water levels and reduce flood risk will continue to be operated by our members of staff.
