

We are hoping to hold a 'back to normal'


Lancashire Night on Saturday 26 November, having missed 2020 and having a somewhat restricted event last year due to the unavailability of catering.

There are a number of scams doing the rounds in the Chorley area at the moment and residents are urged to be careful.

Council Tax rebate - criminals are contacting residents requesting bank details to send the rebate to. Please

be aware Chorley Council will automatically pay the rebate into resident's bank accounts.

Government Energy rebate - similar to the council tax rebate scam. Again bank details are requested.

Energy bills - callers purporting to be from OFGEM saying you can apply for your rebate and a discount on your autumn energy bills. The sole purpose of the call is to try to get your bank account details.

Always remember, councils and genuine companies will <u>**never**</u> ask for your bank details over the phone.

And finally.... a scam to get a digital voice signature from you involving callers asking lots of different questions trying to get you to say the word 'Yes'. They then go on to ask further personal questions. Please do not interact with calls like this, hang up immediately and report the call to your telephone provider and Action Fraud (see below).
